GRAND PARKWAY

The SH99 Grand Parkway Project Segment H, I-1 and I-2 is a \$855 million design-build roadway construction project by the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) in northeast Houston that spans 52.5 miles through Chambers, Harris, Liberty and Montgomery counties. The project will substantially increase capacity along SH 99 with the construction of one to two new tolled lanes in each direction between US 59 to Interstate 10 (I-10) and four additional toll lanes from I-10 to SH 146.
